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Welcome to the Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost!

Introduction

In today's first reading God uses the Gentile ruler Cyrus to accomplish divine purposes. When the Pharisees try to trap Jesus, he tells them to give the emperor what belongs to him and to God what belongs to God. To gather for worship reminds us that our ultimate allegiance is to God rather than to any earthly authority. Created in the image of God, we offer our entire selves in the service of God and for the sake of the world.

Overview

What's in Your Wallet? Not Enough.

Say the word stewardship in some congregations and people are protectively guarding their wallets faster than you can say "pledge card!" Unfortunately, too often we associate stewardship exclusively with issues of money. The good news is that God has little interest in our wallets. God wants our whole lives, wallets and all! Nevertheless, this week is prime time for stewardship campaigns in congregations around the country. The stewardship theme is reflected in our announcements, our prayers, our songs, and our readings. Today's gospel provides an ideal time to reflect on stewardship of all sorts—time, talent, and financial treasures.

The Pharisees approach Jesus in a thinly veiled attempt to trap him on issues of financial obligations to the Roman government. Their question of Jesus, simplified to the extreme, is "who gets your wallet?" If Jesus answered one way, he would be guilty of treason. If he answered the other way, he would have been considered guilty of heresy in the eyes of the religious leaders. Jesus responds by issuing a challenge of his own—give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and give to God what belongs to God. This statement challenges us to ponder: if God created the world and everything in it, what doesn't belong to God? God wants a whole lot more than just your wallet. God wants your life, wallet and all!

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:
Grace to you and peace.

²We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly ³remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, ⁵because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, ⁷so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. ⁹For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, ¹⁰and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.



Upcoming Commemorations

Luke, Evangelist

Sunday, October 18, 2020

Identified as the author of both Luke and Acts, Luke was careful to place the events of Jesus' life in their social and religious contexts. His gospel gives us some of the most beloved parables, as well as the songs of Zechariah, Mary, the angels, and Simeon.

James of Jerusalem, martyr, died around 62

Friday, October 23, 2020

One of three early-church leaders named James, this man is identified in the New Testament and by a historian of the time as a brother of Jesus. Scholars are uncertain whether this means a blood brother. He was a leader of the church in Jerusalem.

JOIN IN THE WORSHIP!

I remember when I went to Germany in 2016. I went with a pastor who, in trying to convince me to pursue the ministry, said I needed to go to the *motherland* and see the origins of our Lutheran faith.

While we were there, we visited many historic sites, many of which were Lutheran. During our time, especially in Heidelberg, we went to many cathedrals; breathtaking, beautiful cathedrals. I remember one in Hamburg that had a choir present. The space was so grand and the sound was so majestic it echoed through the massive cathedral, encompassing and encasing your very being. The music made it as if time itself stood still as the music and mellifluous voices rang out in worship and praise to God. What a sight to behold and experience to be felt.

Our Psalm produces a similar experience. If you shut your eyes and listen to the Psalm, it might be able to take you to a similar space and place where the worship encompasses and encases your spirit so that time itself will be shut out and you will be caught in a moment of pure bliss.

The Psalmist begins with the command *to sing*. This turns to the command to *declare*; and this becomes *ascribe* until we are left with a *worship* that rings out to the nations, proclaiming that Jesus is Lord. At this declaration, the entirety of all creation rings out in praise. The Psalmist is intentional to contrast heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in it, and below it. This indicates that there is no part of creation that is left out from this cry of worship.

In the same way that all of creation is included in this magnificent song, so too we are invited to sing that song to God with the song that is our life. Join in the worship!
